3 wire-bound single subject notebooks (8 1/2 X 11")- one each for Math, English and Religion

2 pocket folders to hold papers and worksheets for Social Studies and Music

2 two- or three-hole inexpensive flexible plastic binders for Science and Reading

1 black and white composition notebook for English journal

Loose leaf paper for class notes and assignments in Reading, English and Science; the paper should fit into the plastic binders

One package Cardboard section dividers to separate topics in the Science binder

Two #2 pencils in school and a reasonable supply at home for homework assignments

2 blue or black ink erasable pens and a reasonable supply at home
